Recovery: Focusing on the individual's journey through the 12 steps outlined in the Big Book, it helps them overcome their addiction and build a new life of sobriety. It emphasizes finding happiness, freedom, and living a useful and productive life.

Unity: Highlighting the importance of the fellowship and the supportive environment that AA provides, it's about members coming together, sharing their experiences, and supporting each other through the challenges of recovery.

Service: By carrying the message of AA to those who still suffer from alcoholism, we're giving back to the community and implementing the primary purpose of AA – helping others find recovery.

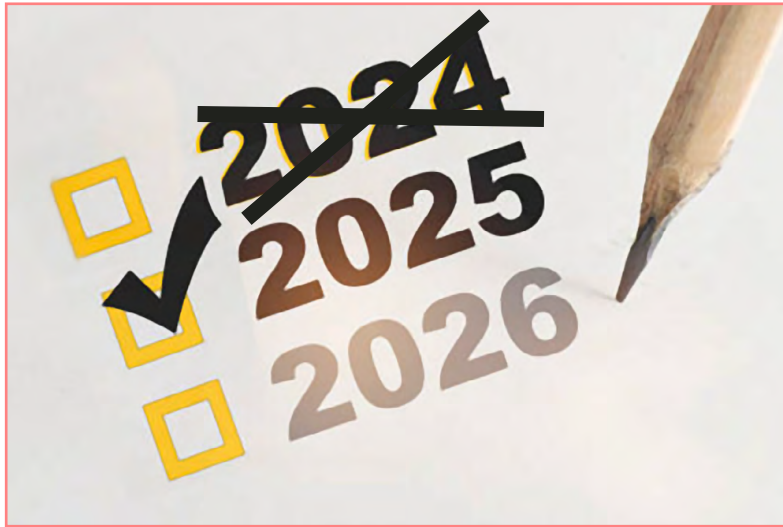

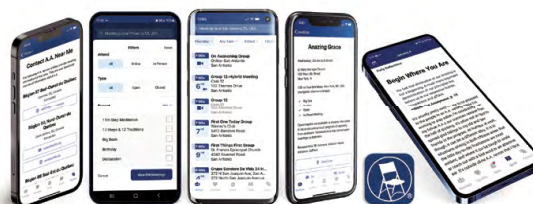


