The District 11 January GSR/Business meeting started with a warm welcome from our new DCM, Marc R.

Our secretary, Mary C.E., then took roll call, and we were introduced to all of the new committee members.

There were a total of 10 committee chairs and 4 GSRs present. Minutes from the December, 2022 meeting were read and approved.

DCM report:

Greetings all,

Thank you for sending me to the Area 24 Service Weekend in Marshalltown on January 7 & 8. The conference was very informative in regards to the history and purpose of AA service as well as to outline the roles and responsibilities of DCMs and committee chairs.

On Saturday January 7, 2023 at the Area 24 Service weekend, we broke off into two groups: the DCMs and the GSRs. I attended the DCM sharing session and was grateful to meet AAs in recovery from all over the state of Iowa. The session was run by the Delegate Julie S.; we each introduced ourselves to the group of DCMs and learned a little bit about each District in attendance, as well as about the DCMs themselves who we will be serving with over the next 2 years. We had a great discussion about reaching out to groups in our District to encourage them to be a part of the District meetings, some very good ideas were shared and I look forward to reaching out in District 11.

In the morning and afternoon, we all learned more about why we are here; preparing our delegate for the General Service Conference and Roberts Rules and the Parliamentary Process that is used as a format for our group, district and area business meetings. The Agenda for the General Service Conference will be made available to us around February 15, 2023. It will be important make this information available to our groups as soon as possible so that we can take any feedback to the March 18 Service weekend. I would like to set up a special meeting with District 11 GSRs and committee chairs to discuss the agenda at or after our March GSR business meeting the first Saturday in March.

As we all begin our 2-year term of service to District 11, I wanted to share with you all a special passage from a past AA Service Manual by Bernard B. Smith, a non-alcoholic, chairperson of the AA Board of Trustees at the 1954 General Service Conference, it is as follows:

January District 11 GSR/Business News

"We may not need a General Service Conference to ensure our own recovery. We do need it to ensure the recovery of the alcoholic who still stumbles in the darkness one short block from this room. We need it to ensure the recovery of a child being born tonight, destined for alcoholism. We need it to provide, in keeping with our Twelfth Step, a permanent haven for all alcoholics who, in the ages ahead, can find in A.A. that rebirth that brought us back to life. We need it because we, more than all others, are conscious of the devastating effect of the human urge for power and prestige which we must ensure can never invade A.A. We need it to ensure A.A. against government, while insulating it against anarchy; we need it to protect A.A. against disintegration while preventing overintegration. We need it so that Alcoholics Anonymous, and Alcoholics Anonymous alone, is the ultimate repository of its Twelve Steps, its Twelve Traditions, and all of its services. We need it to ensure that changes within A.A. come only as a response to the needs and the wants of all A.A., and not of any few. We need it to ensure that the doors of the halls of A.A. never have locks on them, so that people for all time who have an alcohol problem may enter these halls unasked and feel welcome. We need it to ensure that Alcoholics Anonymous never asks anyone who needs us what his or her race is, what his or her creed is, what his or her social position is."

Sunday morning at the Service Weekend we held an Area 24 Business Meeting and shortly afterward began the trip home.

The next District 11 business meeting will be Saturday February 4, 2023 at 10:30 am at Westside in Dubuque; all who are interested in participating in or learning about service work at the District level are welcome to attend.

On Friday night we had a state roll call where any recovering alcoholic's state is recognized. We had 25 states throughout the U.S. and we had 1 person from Japan. We also had a main speaker Friday night Chip H. from Memphis Tennessee and his message was simple: clean house, trust God, and help others. Saturday was an awesome time. We have created a PowerPoint for our outreach, and were displaying that at our outreach table. We also sold merchandise and were handing out stickers, which were a big hit. I had attended a couple of panels throughout the day, and then we had our big sobriety countdown; by that time, we had 1,030 recovering alcoholics at the Fairmont Hotel. We had 1 person with 45 years, all the way down to 24 hours; also 5 people with 7 days or less. We also had a main speaker Cyndi M. from Louisville Ky. She gave an awesome talk. Then we danced the night away with a speakeasy theme dance. There were also games and laser tag and a bunch of recovering alcoholics having fun staying sober.

As for the Iowa Young people of Alcoholics Anonymous (IAYPAA) our next event is March 18th; 1pm-4pm, at the Davenport Alano Club. We are having a Disco karaoke speaker panel with a 70s casserole.

Traditions Checklist

ISSUE #7

Are you familiar with the **Traditions Checklist**? Each month, our newsletter will feature questions from the Traditions Checklist that correlate to the current newsletter month. Since this newsletter covers the 1st, 2nd and 3rd months (January/February/March), we will feature the questions for Traditions One, Two and Three:



These questions * were originally published in Grapevine in conjunction with a series of articles on the Twelve Traditions that ran from November 1969 to September 1971. While they were originally intended as suggestions for individual use, many AA groups have since adopted them and use them as a basis for wider discussion.

Tradition One:

Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon AA unity.

- 1. Am I in my group a healing, mending, integrating person? Am I sometimes divisive? Do I ever gossip or take another member's inventory?
- 2. Am I a peacemaker? Or do I foster arguments with statements such as "just for the sake of discussion"?
- 3. Am I gentle with those who rub me the wrong way, or am I sometimes abrasive?
- 4. Do I make competitive AA remarks, such as comparing one group with another or contrasting AA in one place with AA in another?
- 5. Do I ever put down some AA activities for not participating in this or that aspect of AA?
- 6. Am I informed about AA as a whole? Do I support AA as a whole in every way I can, or just the parts that I understand and approve of?
- 7. Am I as considerate of AA members as I want them to be of me?
- 8. Do I spout platitudes about love while indulging in and secretly justifying behavior that bristles with hostility?

Tradition Two:

For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.

- 1. Do I criticize or do I trust and support my group officers, AA committees and office workers? Newcomers? Old-timers?
- 2. Am I absolutely trustworthy, even in secret, with AA Twelfth Step jobs or other AA responsibilities?
- 3. Do I look for credit in my AA jobs, praise for my AA ideas?
- 4. Do I often feel the need to "save face" in group discussions, or can I yield in good spirit to the group conscience and work along with it?
- 5. Although I have been sober a few years, am I still willing to serve my turn with AA chores?
- 6. Do I complain about the decisions that my group makes, even though I do not attend the business meetings where these decisions are made?

Tradition Three:

The only requirement for AA membership is a desire to stop drinking.

- 1. In my mind, do I prejudge some new AA members as those who likely will not make it?
- 2. Is there some kind of alcoholic whom I privately or publicly do not want in my AA group?
- 3. Do I set myself up as a judge of whether a newcomer is sincere or not?
- 4. Do I let language, religion (or lack of it), race, education, age, sexual identity or other such things interfere with my carrying the message?
- 5. Am I overimpressed by a celebrity, a doctor, a clergyman, an ex-convict? Or can I just treat this new member simply and naturally as one more sick human, like the rest of us?
- 6. When someone turns up at AA needing information or help (even if he can't ask for it aloud), does it really matter to me what they do for a living? Where they live? What their domestic arrangements are? Whether they have been to AA before? What their other problems are?

About Meeting Guide

Meeting Guide syncs with area, district, intergroup/central offices and international general service office websites, relaying meeting information from more than 400 A.A. service entities directly to the app. Over 100,000 weekly meetings are currently listed, and the information is refreshed twice daily.

Meeting Guide features

- Listing of both in-person and online meetings
- A default view that provides a list of meetings showing time, location and meeting name
- A meeting detail view that offers extra information such as meeting format and any notes provided by the group
- A search function to find meetings by location or keyword
- A daily quote feature lets users read from "Daily Reflections"
- Multiple access points that make finding local A.A. contact information easy
- A news feature with the latest from the General Service Office and Grapevine






